

Revised Statement on Satisfactory Academic Progress
Effective Fall 2004

The following is the revision of the Satisfactory Academic Progress section on page 33 of the *Texas College Catalog*:

Texas College allows a maximum of five years for completion of academic degree programs. The College uses the Academic Year as the increment for review of satisfactory progress. Review of academic progress is conducted by the Office of Academic Affairs annually at the end of the Academic Year. Students receive notice of their standing at that time if they are not in progress. Normally, to progress successfully toward graduation, students are expected to complete at least 30 hours each Academic Year. To remain in good standing, and to receive financial aid, the student must complete at least 80% of the expected 30 hours by the end of each increment (Academic Year) and must achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 each Academic Year. To assist in the adjustment of the student to the College environment, a graduated cumulative grade point average (CGPA) standard is outlined in the scale below:

<u>Hours Earned</u>	<u>CGPA</u>
1 - 18	1.50
19 - 36	1.80
37 and above	2.00

To continue to receive financial aid, the student must also not exceed 150% of the credit hours attempted toward the total number of semester hours published as the length of the degree program. For example, the student in a 124 semester hour program must not exceed 186 attempted hours to complete that program. In addition, the student must have earned 2.00 to graduate.
